



NEED TO KNOW

TIPS TO MAKE THE MOST OF THE HPM HEDIS BONUS PLAN

To Qualify for HPM's HEDIS Bonus plan, providers must follow the HEDIS and MDCH Guidelines. Note that services that are delivered but do not meet strict HEDIS guidelines will not be eligible for a bonus.

Immunizations-Childhood

- All immunizations must be completed **before** the child's 2nd birthday
- Required Immunizations are:
 - * 4 DTaP/DT
 - * 3 IPV
 - * 1 MMR
 - * 3 HIB
 - * 3 Hepatitis B (At least 1 between 6months and 2nd birthday)
 - * 1 VZV
 - * 4 PCV (Pneumococcal Conjugate)
- If child has had the chicken pox or any of the other diseases, document that information along with a date in the medical record. Children with documented occurrence are excluded from the immunization.

Immunizations-Adolescent

- All immunizations must be completed **before** the child's 13th birthday
- Required Immunizations are:
 - * 2nd MMR (One on or between the 4th and 13th birthday, or 2 MMRs between the 1st and 4th birthday)
 - * 3 Hepatitis B (At least 1 between 2nd and 13th birthday)
 - * 1 VZV (Must be between 2nd and 13th birthday)
- If child has had the chicken pox or any of the other diseases, document that information along with a date in the medical record. Children with documented occurrence are excluded from the immunization.

Well Child Visits

There are 3 types of Well Child Visits; they are Well Child Visits in the first 15 months of life, Well Child visits for children 3-6 years of age and Adolescent Well Care for those aged 12 to 21. The following information applies to all of the Well Child Visits:

- The well child visit must occur with a Primary Care Physician but does not have to be with the practitioner that is assigned to the child. (Adolescents that are seen by an OB/GYN provider can count as a well visit as long as there is evidence that all three components are met)
- All well child visits must have evidence of 3 components to be considered as a well child visit. These components must be documented in the medical record. The three components are:
 - A health and developmental history of the child (both physical and mental)

- A physical exam
- Health education/anticipatory guidance (seatbelt/car seat safety, nutrition, developmental milestones, etc...)
